

An Ordinance Regulating the Parking of Vehicles on  
Certain Portions of Streets in the Town of Vernon.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Vernon that from and after the enactment of this ordinance:

Section I. It shall be unlawful for the owner or person in control of any vehicle to permit any vehicle to remain parked during the hours between 7:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. on the west side of Pike Street, between Brown Street and Jackson Street, in the Town of Vernon continuously in one place for any period of time in excess of one hour, provided that this ordinance shall not be in effect on Sundays and legal holidays.

Section II. Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be notified of such violation by a written notice affixed by the Town Marshal to the vehicle illegally parked and shall remit a fine in the sum of \$1.00 to the Clerk-Treasurer of the Town of Vernon within twenty-four hours subsequent to the time the violation commenced.

Section III. Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance and who fails to remit the fine as provided by Section II of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than \$10.00 or more than \$25.00.

Section IV. If in the sole discretion of the Marshal of the Town of Vernon any vehicle which is parked in violation of this ordinance constitutes an obstruction to traffic or to commerce in the Town of Vernon, the Town Marshal may have such vehicle towed to the nearest garage and stored until called for by the owner. The costs of towing and storage shall be paid by the owner or person in control of the vehicle and shall not be in lieu of any fine or penalty imposed by the other terms of this ordinance.
